National Child Abuse Prevention Month...



Hendersonville Ice Cream Trail


Need a fun weekend getaway with the family? How about a sweet ice cream trail?

MONTGOMERY GI BILL

Selected Reserve Chapter 1606

- Receive up to \$481 per month
- Tax free payments
- CAN be combined with FTA

Selected Reserve Kicke

- Receive up to an additional \$350 per month
- Enlisted, non-prior service; 50 or higher on ASVAB, enlist in a critical skill
- Enlisted, prior service; 50 or higher on ASVAB/AFCT, DMOSQ qualified, E-7 or below
- Enlisted currently serving; Completed at least 3, but no more than 14 years

Active-Duty Chapter 30

- Pay \$1,200, up to an additional \$600 to buy in
- · A monthly payment is paid directly to the Soldier based on amount of active duty served.

North Carolina Tuition Assistance Program NCTAP

- Receive *up to* a 100% tuition and fee reimbursemen towards a qualifying North Carolina based school
 - Public
 - Private
 - Promise
- Flight
- Any of the 58 community colleges
- Associates, Bachelors, Masters, Doctorate
- Must have two years remaining on your contract from the end of term date
- Application periods:
- Fall Term: August 1 August 31
- Spring Term: January 1 January 30
- Summer Term: April 12 May 10

Reimbursement is based on annual NC budget and type of school attended

Post- 9/11 Chapter 33

- Tuition and Fees: • Up to 100% of in-state tuition at public schools
- Book Stipend: • Up to \$1,000 per academic year
- Monthly Housing Allowance
- Payments are based on qualifying service:
- 36 Months = 100% (Includes Purple Heart) 30 Months = 90% • 24 Months = 80% • 18 Months = 70% • 6 Months = 60% • 90 Days = 50% Possible to transfer benefits to a dependent after

meeting certain obligations

Federal Tuition Assistance

- Up to \$4,500 per year. If you qualify, you may receive 100 percent of the tuition cost up to\$250 per semester hour
 - \$167 per quarter hour
 - \$16.66 per clock hour

Credentialing Assistance

- Up to \$2,000 per year to pay for a credential
- Can be combined with FTA, not to exceed \$4,500
