September 2025



"Preparedness Starts at Home"

Emergencies can take place in your home or community being prepared for any disaster takes a plan.

SUICIDE PREVENTION AWARENESS MONTH

Where the nation raises awareness and promotes resources to prevent death by suicide. According to the CDC Suicide is the second leading cause of death for individuals 15-24.

It can be hard to think of the right words to say when someone you care about appears to be struggling or tells you they want to end their life. By opening up, your friend, teammate, or loved one is indicating they want to communicate what they are experiencing, and it gives you the opportunity to support them.
